<p>Unfinished Business</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Approved changes to Board Policy 5:330 which specifies policy related to Sick days, Vacation days, Holidays, and Leaves of employees. • Approved the addition of a 1.0 FTE Social Worker. • Approved an additional Custodial Worker position. • Approved the revised 2020-2021 School Calendar, which specifies a teacher start date of August 14, and student first date of attendance on August 20. • Approved the PERA (Performance Evaluation) Appeal Memorandum of Understanding. • Approved a 3% compensation increase for a sub-set of Educational Support Personnel for Fiscal Year 2021. • Discussed Building Utilization.
<p>New Business</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dr. Warke informed the Board that the IASB Triple I conference scheduled for November 20-22 has been cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic. • Approved the Intergovernmental Agreement with District 102 for a shared Communications Employee position. • Discussed a Memorandum of Understanding for Tenured Teacher Evaluations. • Approved the addition of two (2) one-year permanent substitute positions for the 2020-2021 School Year to alleviate difficulties regarding local substitute shortages, taking particular note of the exacerbation of these shortages for the coming school year due to the coronavirus pandemic.
